



The first Danville Hotel, built in 1858, burned down in 1873. Pictured here is the "new" Danville Hotel built after the railroad came in 1891. Located east of the Danville station on Railroad Avenue, the McCauley family owned and ran the 8- to 10-room hotel. Salesmen from the train and bachelor workers stayed there. The hotel and McCauley residence were moved to face Hartz Avenue in 1927, where they remain today.
